Bridging Standards and Innovations

Q1: How have you been involved with impacting standards in the wheelchair mobility community?

A: Bodypoint has been participating in the development of US and International Standards since about 1999. Our focus has mostly been in the area of "wheelchair seating", but because this is so dependent on broader standards for assistive technology, we've become regular contributors to standards for assistive devices, terminology, measurement, and manual and power wheelchairs in general. The committees working on these standards consist of experts from around the world, in disciplines including clinicians, university researchers, engineers, and representatives from government regulatory agencies. As a manufacturer with a lot of hands-on experience testing seating and positioning devices, we've been welcomed into many

committees because of our practical knowledge and ability to bridge communication gaps between clinicians and other engineers.

Q2: What would people be most surprised to learn about?

A: Well, I think it would have to be Bodypoint's role in developing a new approach to testing for flammability. We are probably mostly known for making postural support devices, not as a research or test lab, but after we gained experience using the older standards to test for resistance to ignition, we were quite motivated to refine the approach so that it would be possible to test more kinds of materials and, especially, to evaluate smaller products for children. We experimented with so many different methods, consulted with experts at numerous professional labs, and invented a simple, cost-effective, and reliable process with low-cost equipment which could be built, anywhere. Our work is embodied in the latest revision of ISO16840-10 Resistance to Ignition of Postural Support Devices, which has been accepted by the FDA, European Standards, and is being considered for adoption into much broader categories for mattresses and furniture.

Q3: What issues are you and the committee focused on for 2024?

A: Perhaps the most important work we are currently focused on is the harmonization of standards, both bringing requirements for individual standards into alignment, but also getting many different global requirements onto the same page. This is essential in an industry where wheelchairs and related seating manufacturers distribute the same products into many different countries. Harmonization raises the bar for everyone, to improve the standards of care for wheelchair users while also clarifying requirements to give us manufacturers a clear path to jumping through the regulatory hoops. This addresses far more than just safety—its improving expected product performance, providing education and guidance to professionals, and helping everyone to speak the same language...all of which results in better outcomes and the justification for appropriate reimbursements to keep us all going.
