A: In all honesty, they are all easy to sew, in my opinion. You just have to ensure that the quality and standard of the product is there. However, before the use of a computerized system, the Evoflex belt required the most skill when sewn by hand. It was difficult mainly because of the material. Even with the computer system now, I still think this is the toughest one to sew while fully meeting quality standards. It's very tricky and takes a lot of patience.


